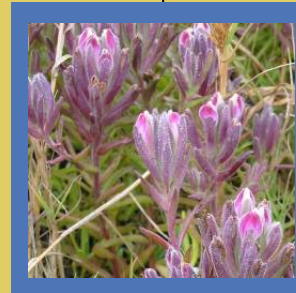




Volunteers have contributed significantly to monitoring, stream and riparian restoration, and outreach efforts.
